Approval Downtown Revitalization Initiative to put aside \$2,500 for rendering and another \$2,500 for planning making a total of \$5,000 to get professional aid for the application.

DRI Description

The DRI project stands for Downtown Revitalization Initiative. It is a competition in which municipalities from across the state apply for \$10 million in funding to completely revitalize their downtown catchment area. The state is broken up into ten regions with one municipality in each region getting funding, our section, the Mid-Hudson region is the most competitive to the point that we're the only region with a 15-page limit as the judges receive so many applications.

The Village has applied the past four years and been unsuccessful every year. Last year (2019) we made great strides to enhance our application to the next level and the feedback was very positive. As the next round begins in early spring, the Village aims to further improve our application by getting professional help with our rendering and planning. Our ask of the board is to put aside \$2,500 for rendering and another \$2,500 for planning making a total of \$5,000 to get professional aid for the application. It is important to note that this application is also taken into consideration by grant organizations even after the DRI process so these enhancements will contribute to more than just one grant application.
