• Village / <u>Utility Improvement Contract 5</u>

- Contract 5 scope includes water connection improvements from Village of Wappingers Falls to the Town of Wappinger on Losee Road (funded by Village DWSRF #18830) and Route 9 Sewer (sewer funds) work not completed near Dutchess Plaza and Arrow Auto Glass during Contract 4.
- Design was submitted in Nov 2020 for agency reviews to NYS and Dutchess County Health Departments, Dutchess County DPW, and NYSDOT for Route 9. Received comments are being addressed.
- Bidding is targeted for early 2021 in preparation for 2021 construction.

• Village / Water Filter Building and Facilities

- In late spring 2020, KC and the Village prepared and submitted a USDA Engineering Report in support of a Village funding application for the proposed Water Filter Building and Facilities at the Water Supply Facility.
- In early 2020, KC completed Preliminary Design for the Water Filter Building and Facilities.
- In Dec 2020, the Village Water Board authorized KC to prepare Final Design for the Water Filter Building and Facilities.
- USDA comments were received on the application. KC and the Village are working on responding to the comments

• Village / Wenliss Water Tank Replacement

• In Dec 2020, the Village Water Board authorized KC to prepare Preliminary Design for the Wenliss Water Tank Replacement.

• Village / Grease Trap Engineering Planning Grant

- Work on the Grease Trap Engineering Planning Grant project continues. Project Committee met August 28, 2020. This is a two-year grant.
- Financial information needed from Village.
- Review by Village Attorney is recommended.
- Work is ready for submittal to the Village and then to NYSEFC.

• Village / <u>Bain Park Survey and Masterplan</u>

- KC Engineering is currently working of the following:
 - Conceptual Master Plan for Bain Park;
 - Site Design for Playground Equipment Area; and
 - Long Form Part 1 EAF.
- Conceptual Master Plan presented to Park Committee February 24, 2021
- Village / EPA Grant Brownfield Assessments
 - Next Steps Phase 2 Assessments Bleachery pending EPA approval of material submitted.

Resolution to ratify appendix B NYS Police Reform and Reinvention Collaborative Plan.

RESOLUTION NO. 032021 of 2021

RESOLUTION ADOPTING WAPPINGERS FALLS POLICE REFORM AND REINVENTION PLAN PURSUANT TO EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 203 OF GOVERNOR ANDREW M. CUOMO, NEW YORK STATE POLICE REFORM AND REINVENTION COLLABORATIVE

The following Resolution was introduced by Trustee Lammers and seconded by Trustee Catalano.

WHEREAS, beginning on May 25, 2020, following the police-involved death of George Floyd in Minnesota, protests have taken place daily throughout the nation and in communities across New York State in response to police-involved deaths and racially-biased law enforcement to demand change, action and accountability; and

WHEREAS, there is a long painful history in New York State of discrimination and mistreatment of black and African-American citizens dating back to the arrival of the first enslaved Africans in America; and

WHEREAS, this recent history includes a number of incidents involving the police that have resulted in the deaths of unarmed civilians, predominantly black and African-American men, that have undermined the public's confidence and trust in our system of law enforcement and criminal justice, and such condition is ongoing and urgently needs to be rectified; and

WHEREAS, these needless deaths have led the Governor of the State of New York to sign into law the "Say Their Name" Agenda, which reforms aspects of policing in New York State; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that government has a responsibility to ensure that all of its citizens are treated equally, fairly and justly before the law; and

WHEREAS, recent outpouring of protests and demonstrations, which have been manifested in every area of the state, have illustrated the depth and breadth of public interest in ending institutional racism and injustice; and

WHEREAS, one of the essential roles of government is to maintain public safety, which requires mutual trust and respect between police and the community they serve; and the success

and safety of our society depends on positive police-community relationships and policies that allow police to do their jobs to protect every member of the public; and

WHEREAS, the Governor has determined that urgent and immediate action is needed to eliminate racial inequities in policing, to modify and modernize policing strategies, policies, procedures and practices, and to develop practices to better address the particular needs of communities of color to promote public safety, improve community engagement and foster trust; and

WHEREAS, the Governor has enacted Executive Order No. 203 entitled the "New York State Police Reform and Reinvention Collaborative", which requires all police agencies perform a comprehensive review of deployments, policies, procedures and practices, and develop an improvement plan; and

WHEREAS, a Stakeholder group, as defined by Executive Order No. 203, was sought and convened to discuss and consider evidence based policing strategies including, but not limited to, use of force policies, procedural justice; any studies addressing systemic racial bias or racial justice in policing,; implicit bias awareness training; de-escalation training and practices; law enforcement assisted diversion programs; restorative justice practices; community-based outreach and conflict resolution; problem-oriented policing; hot spots policing; focused deterrence; crime prevention through environmental design; violence prevention and reduction interventions; model policies and guidelines promulgated by the New York State Municipal Police Training Council; and standards promulgated by the New York State Law Enforcement Accreditation Program; and

WHEREAS, on October 21, 2020, the Village of Wappingers Falls formed a Police Reform Committee to discuss the Governor's Executive Order; and

WHEREAS, on October 29, 2020, the first meeting of the Stakeholders was held and discussions took place regarding the personnel, training, recruitment and equipment in the police department, and all Stakeholders was provided a copy of the New York State Reform and Reinvention Guide; and

WHEREAS, on November 5, 2020, a second meeting of the Stakeholders was held and the Stakeholders were presented with copies of the revised Use of Force Policy and the General Orders, and discussed the de-escalation training that took place in July; and

WHEREAS, on November 19, 2020, a third meeting of the Stakeholders was held and Dr. St. Germain from Mental Health spoke about available programs; and

WHEREAS, on November 25, 2020, a fourth meeting of the Stakeholders was held and speakers talked about the available homeless programs and mobile crisis talked about how they could respond and assist officers with a person in crisis; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on January 13, 2021, at which time the Wappingers Falls Police Reform and Reinvention Plan was made public to allow for public input on the proposed Plan; and

WHEREAS, revisions were made to the Wappingers Falls Police Reform and Reinvention Plan in accordance with public comment and an additional public hearing was held on January 27, 2021 to present the revised Plan for further public comment, which public hearing was adjourned; and

WHEREAS, a final public hearing was held on February 10, 2021, and no further comments were received; now, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Village Board of Trustees of the Village of Wappingers Falls hereby adopts the Wappingers Falls Police Reform and Reinvention Plan pursuant to Executive Order No. 203 of Governor Andrew M. Cuomo, New York State Police Reform and Reinvention Collaborative; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that certified copies of this Resolution be forwarded to Governor Andrew M. Cuomo and New York State Budget Director Robert F. Mujica, B.A., M.G.A., J.D.
